

# Julie's Jazz Notes

As we approach the end of another church program year, we can reflect on how challenging a year it has been with both losses and new opportunities!

We have suffered some personal losses to our community with the deaths of Jennifer Tow and Gerry Eddy. And we have taken on some new opportunities with our first parish intern Sara Green, and with the ordination of Maggie Lovins as a UU community minister with UUCP.

We have struggled with a difficult national election cycle and the threat to social justice issues that have been activated in its wake, including serious threats to racial justice in America. We have experienced

some of this within our larger UU movement with the sudden resignation of UUA president Peter Morales at the end of his tenure and other senior staff in response to charges of hiring discrimination in our denomination. All of this, as many of us are preparing to attend the UU General Assembly in New Orleans next month with the theme "Resist and Rejoice."

And if all that isn't enough to raise your blood pressure, on April 23 leaders of our church finance team made a presentation asking our members and friends to consider increasing their personal pledges to next year's church operating budget so that we wouldn't have to make some difficult decisions in

cutting some church programming.

Meanwhile at our Annual Meeting on May 21 after the service we will be electing new leaders and deciding on a new social justice theme for the coming year. If you have any ideas for a new social justice theme, or for local non-profits that are doing great work that could be supported by one of our Fifth Sunday "Share the Plate" offerings, please contact either Paula Montgomery or Scott Satterwhite, our social justice ministry team co-leaders.

**April Board Meeting Synopsis:**

The Board discussed the current state of pledge receipts and the approximately \$17,000 shortfall in the 2017-18 budget. Materials and information to be presented to the congregation on April 23, 2017 in an effort to address the shortfall were reviewed and approved. It was noted that some members are probably already at their full giving capacity with their pledge but the second ask is needed to try to address such a large shortfall.

Rev. Dr. Julie Kain gave a brief update on recent upheavals in the UUA leadership at the national and Southern Region levels. (Sara Green discussed

some of these events in her column in the April 2017 issue of The Light.) There are many resources available online with further information.

Research has shown that, because of the size of our congregation, UUCP is entitled to three official delegates to General Assembly, rather than two. Anyone interested in being the third delegate is asked to let Rev. Julie or a member of the Board know as soon as possible.

The Board approved the purchase of the UUA website template, which will be used to redesign the UUCP website and make it easier to update, as well as making it more accessible on mobile devices. Charlie Steed is in charge of the team undertaking the redesign, and volunteers are needed and welcome.

The Board approved the Leadership Development Team's proposed slate of elected positions for the coming church year. The slate will be publicized to the congregation in advance of the Annual Meeting on May 21.

**Sara's Sayings**

In the summer, fast approaching, my extroverted self comes out! I want to be at every gathering, meeting all the people and having all the fun. I embrace the sun and

indulge in its warmth. I fill my tummy with watermelon and crawfish until I'm about to burst. I go on adventure after adventure because, when I was younger, there was no place to be. I find my way to every bonfire or bluegrass festival with every intention of dancing the night away. But this summer is different- for me, at least. This summer, I know that the world still turns and decisions are still being made. I am more aware, now, of the need to care for myself and my community. This summer I must take responsibility for the nine Black trans women who have been killed since January, the legislative threats to my reproductive justice and threats to de-fund the arts. Mostly clearly, I see my task in two parts. The first part is to take seriously what sort of self-care is needed in the moment. It'll be the nights full of dancing AND the nights spent alone in meditation. It'll be the bluegrass and the meaningful conversations about resistance. This summer, I will need to prioritize the practices that ground and center me. Secondly, I will need to be confident in fun and pleasure as resistance. Not being dictated by the atrocities of the world is, for me, revolutionary. Shirley Caesar, a gospel singer, says, "the world didn't give it and the world can't take it away." What a word! The gift of that quote was a recognition of where one's power and joy comes from. This summer, it will be my task to celebrate the power and joy I get from the communities I'm a part of. I hope you'll join me in living in the tension of summertime and the times in which we live- exploring fully resistance, joy, community, and pleasure. .

1. 2. Bring us your **portable folding tables by Sunday, April 30**. Be sure to put your name on the underside of your table. Items sell better that are displayed on tables easy to see and examine. Tables can be picked up on Sunday, May 7. We always need more tables!
3. Contact Georgianna Bryant if you have a vehicle such as a **pick up truck** that can be used to pick up heavy items from members' homes who are unable to get these items to the church. Mark Beyerl has offered his truck and will coordinate the pick-ups but he needs helpers. Also contact us if you need large or heavy items picked up and brought to the church.

4. Plan to **stay after church Sunday, April 30** to help with initial set up. Help is needed to set up some long tables and to bring items from storage (the pod) to the church foyer. Just thirty minutes or an hour or so would help a lot. ☺
5. Volunteer to help with set up and pricing of items on **Monday, May 1, Tuesday, May 2 and Wednesday, May 3** beginning at **9:00 a.m.** (until about 4:00 p.m.) —any shift during these times will be appreciated. A sandwich lunch will be provided. Other food donations appreciated. We need lots of helpers just to organize items so they will sell better. No expertise required. Remember volunteer helpers find the "early bargains." We may also work **Thursday, May 4** if we don't get done on Wednesday.
6. Volunteer to help with actual sale on **Friday, May 5 and Saturday, May 6**. Any shift you can work between 7:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. would be great. Help will also be needed on Saturday from about 1:00 p.m. until 2:00 p.m. to help pack up any remaining items for donation to charity.
