I am loving spring; plants are blooming, new growth is bursting out all over, everything is greening up and the days are lengthening. It is a time of Transformation.

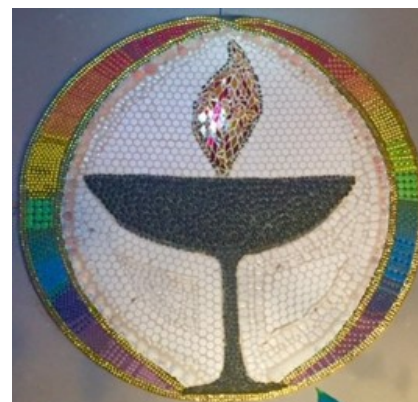

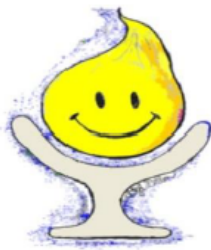

Apr 22 - Second Hour Spirit in Practice Workshop #6: Body Practices (facilitator TBD) - This workshop is focused on having participants come to understand their spiritual journey to be not separate from their own physical experiences, but deeply rooted in them. An obvious choice would be to introduce one of the more well-known physical practices such as yoga or tai chi. LUUNCH BUUNCH



For April's 2nd Wednesday, the 11th, we'll stay on 9th Avenue to visit The Tuscan Oven (lately requested by several) at 481 N. 9th Ave., at 484-6836 (OVEN, cute, eh?). Royce St.'s intersection with the west side of 9th immediately follows, FYI...I asked if they do whole wheat pizzas, and the answer was negative; however, they do offer gluten-free pizzas, ingredients unknown to the pizza man, as they are delivered. (Perhaps he'll have read that info before our April visit.) Let's reserve for this one, via Hugh T. at 467-2373 or huturn@juno.com, by the Monday before, 9 April. Non-reservers prepare to sit at table 2.

Get 'em while they're hot. ... Well, I'm just back from Mr. Shawarma's, and I think the turnout, by "all" of you, was about right, being only me, Michael and Rev. Bob. I went for the non-chicken side of the menu, and must say that I was very disappointed as to both Quantity (relative to price), and Taste appeal. The tabbouleh (at \$7/ cup, +/-) was colorful but otherwise had no personality, no significant taste characteristics, almost bland (and did I say, too little in quantity?). The falafel was similarly uninteresting after the first few bites; halfway thru, a request for some sauce to remedy the dryness offered some thin tahini, more "lemony" than sesame like.....Both Bob and Michael had chicken dishes, either of which could have fed two, though about the same price of my vegetarian appetizer choices. I guess that is an example of chicken being cheaper than parsley and bulgar wheat. (I'll have to visit Hummus, a few hundred feet to the south, for price and quality comparisons).

For May, how does Bonehead's on 9 Mile/UWF near UWF East entrance sound? The reason for asking, and so early, is that a "15% of the bill" donation to UUCP is possible, but it has to be reserved in advanced - or some other group (eligible for donations) can get that particular day/time, which for us is the second Wednesday of the month. ... As long as I get no more than 1 or 2 negatives, I will reserve it. Several other Pensacola restaurants were also on the list, but only Bonehead's offered lunch times for reservation. Please RSVP.

UUCP SPRING YARD SALE FRIDAY, MAY 4TH AND SATURDAY, MAY 5TH

1. Bring items to the church beginning **Monday, April 16** or arrange to bring your items when someone is at the church during the week. Kitchen items, linens, toys, children's books, outdoor items, furniture, electronics, shoes, purses, hats, knickknacks, tools, jewelry, pictures, collectibles, appliances, gardening, and pet items are all good sellers. Items can be placed in the back hallway. If you can put the items in **stackable boxes**, that would be a "big help."
2. Bring us your **portable folding tables by Sunday, April 29**. Be sure to put your name on underside. Items sell better that are displayed on tables easy to see and examine. Tables can be picked up on Sunday, May 6. We always need more tables!
3. Contact Georgianna Bryant if you have a vehicle such as a **pick-up truck** that can be used to pick up heavy items from member's homes that are unable to get these items to the church. If you don't have a truck, but can help with pick-ups, the truck driver always needs helpers. Also contact us if you need large or heavy items picked up and brought to the church.
4. Plan to **stay after church Sunday, April 29** to help with initial set up. Help is needed to set up some long tables and to bring items from storage (the pod outside) to the church foyer. Just thirty minutes or an hour or so would help a lot. ☺
5. Volunteer to help with set up and pricing of items on **Monday, April 30, Tuesday, May 1, and Wednesday, May 2** beginning at **9:00 a.m.** (until about 4:00 p.m.) –any shift during these times will be appreciated. A sandwich lunch will be provided. Other food donations appreciated. We need lots of helpers just to organize items so they will sell better. No expertise required. Remember volunteer helpers find the "early bargains." We may also work **Thursday, May 3** if we don't get done on Wednesday.
6. Volunteer to help with actual sale on **Friday, May 4** and **Saturday, May 5**. Any shift you can work between 7:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. would be great. Help will also be needed on Saturday from about 1:00 p.m. until 2:00 p.m. to help pack up any remaining items for donation to charity.
