DIRECTIONS FOR DIALOGUE:

Please mix to sit in groups of 6-7, ideally separate from spouses, partners, or closest friends. Each group should have one notebook. Volunteer, please jot a few notes.

DIRECTIONS

Take a moment to silently read and consider quotes in each category. You will have 4-5 minutes to discuss each of four concepts. We'll share a bit in whole group if time allows.

When dialogue begins, please respect and listen to each person's comments. Allow time for each contributor (with no inappropriate domination), and keep confidences as warranted or requested. Also honor silence, if chosen.

Quotes will project separately for each of four dialogues. Quickly read all quotes on Independence, for example, then discuss that particular concept. Mention any quotes you may find salient. We will focus separately on each concept, but it's OK to mention others any time. They are inter-related anyway.

As you discuss, please try to consider and share from your own personal experiences rather than merely abstract ideas.

SOME QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

How do you interpret, think, and feel about each concept?

Have your understanding of and feelings about each concept changed over time, perhaps with different exposures, experiences, WANTS and NEEDS evolving over decades? How and why do you think this is?

Might your responses vary if you differed in age, race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, socio-economic level, religion, health, personality, etc.?
