
Showing Up For Our UU Living Tradition

We are entering a momentous time for Unitarian Universalism. In a few months, we will gather for General Assembly (GA) either in person in Portland, OR, or online wherever you are. This will be an exciting and inclusive multiplatform experience with unprecedented opportunities to engage with UUs from across the country and around the world.



To support broad participation and provide time for discernment about business decisions up for a vote this year, the UUA Board of Trustees is offering multiple online events for UUs to take part in now and in the coming weeks. In this time when democratic institutions in our wider world are ever more under threat, it matters that we can show up faithfully for the democratic practices that make our faith tradition strong.

New UUA President to Be Elected in 2023



Our UUA President, the Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray, is in her fifth year of a six-year term, and UUs will elect a new president at GA 2023.

The Presidential Search Committee (PSC) will be accepting applications through the deadline on July 15. Continuing the UUA's commitment to dismantling white supremacy culture and other systems of oppression and receiving a wide pool of diverse applicants are top commitments of the search committee.

Candidates may also run by petition rather than through the PSC process. The petition process opens on December 1, 2022, and closes on February 1, 2023.



Just In Time for Pride Month!



Just in time for <u>Pride Month</u>, our congregation met for the Annual Meeting and voted on the long-awaited Welcoming Congregation Designation. After eight months of discussions and educational events led by the Welcoming Congregation Committee, the motion to authorize an application to UUA was approved in a resounding majority vote.



The application is currently underway, and we hope to have a response before the end of the month. Once our congregation is recognized as a <u>Welcoming Congregation</u>, the UUA LGBTQ Ministries will send us an official letter of recognition and two posters that celebrate our Welcoming status. Congregations are encouraged to develop their own additional artwork—banners, plaques, and the like that further lift up our welcome.

Our congregation will also be recognized on the UUA website: a rainbow chalice will appear next to our name, and we will show up in searches for Welcoming Congregations in our area using the UUA tool. We will celebrate the status on our own website as well!

We are very proud of our congregation wanting to provide a warm and loving spiritual community for everyone, especially here and now in a political climate which is becoming more and more unfriendly to adults and children who are LGBTQIA+. We feel that displaying this designation can not only grow our congregation and make us a stronger church, but also that offering a loving and friendly community to

people who may be experiencing rejection and isolation actually has the potential to save lives.



UUCP did an outstanding job of striving for justice on May 2nd at the Wahoo Stadium. Fifty-one (!) of our members attended along with many from other congregations of different faiths. We were there to hold our elected officials accountable in the interest of local Justice.

Please plan to attend the celebration on June 13th. JUST Pensacola Clergy, Team Members, and Network members are invited to join our first in-person Celebration!

This event is tentatively scheduled to be held at B'nai Israel Synagogue. We'll gather to celebrate our victories and progress over the past year as well as discuss what is to come!

# How do we Strive for Justice and Inspire Love?





More than 50 UUCP members and friends joined with 675+

other local congregants at Blue Wahoos Stadium on Monday to ask our community leaders to support worthwhile, measurable initiatives in the areas of housing and criminal justice.

UUCP had 51 members and friends present for the event, second only to one other congregation



with 81 folks present. We are a small congregation, but we are mighty, and we stand up for justice! Because we showed up today with our neighbors and because we continue to support JUST Pensacola in tangible ways, we got YES commitments from the leaders present. On housing, City Council members Ann Hill and Casey Jones agreed to consider creating a trust fund to support expansion of rental housing stock. On criminal justice, Pensacola Police Chief Eric Randall and Florida First Circuit State Attorney Ginger Bowen

Madden agreed to meet with other stakeholders to discuss the development of a second screening process to review cases and identify youth who might benefit from a civil citation and to consider expanding civil citations for use among adults who commit minor offenses.

Our work is not completed, however. Now we must continue to monitor these issues and to hold these leaders accountable to these commitments. We also must continue building relationships with these leaders and the others who were not present at the event, despite being invited. We also get to celebrate on Monday, June 13, 6pm. Stay tuned for more on our JUST Pensacola involvement.
