From Your Board: President's Column

My Dear Church Community,

We had our very first meeting of the new 2022 -2023 Board of Directors, consisting of our annual "Board Retreat" held Saturday, August 20, in the auditorium of Azalea Trace, a lovely, large space, graciously arranged for us by Georgieanna Bryant, who resides there. She



told me that her dear friend, Barbara Goggins was very anxious for Georgieanna to join her there, and there was a sad sweetness to the fact that Barbara waited for her friend to get settled before she passed on to her next adventure in the great beyond.

Our Retreat was a day-long gathering in which new and old board members got to know each other better to facilitate better communication, and we learned about or reviewed the established workings of the church, while examining how things might change for the better. We also had some decisions to make about reassigning some of the minister's duties which existed outside of providing the Sunday Services. It was a very productive and congenial meeting, with some great immediate results. One thing that pleases me greatly is that Scott Satterwhite has volunteered to chair the Building and Grounds team. The team consists of Jack Wolverton, Daniel Cobb, Jay Butcher, and anyone else who would like to volunteer. Another wonderful result is that we have a new location and a date for our Annual (or semi-annual) UUCP Campout! There hasn't been a campout since 2019, and many of us have fond memories of great times and miss it. Joe Vinson suggested his parent's property in Century, which is a lovely place with lots of space, and lovely water features. It's close enough to Pensacola that it's quite feasible for people to just come for some of the activities, even if they don't want to camp out. There is even a cabin with a few beds available for some of us who are just not able to sleep in a tent. The date has been set, and a committee organized to plan the activities. The second topic is to report on our Welcoming Congregation application. We submitted the application to UUA on May 28, just a few days after our congregational vote, and the UUA website stated that we should allow 60 days for a response. Throughout the summer, I followed up several times in several ways and finally the program director contacted us, and we arranged our Zoom interview, which happened with our committee on Thursday, August 18. The director of the program approved our application! As it turns out, there is a lot of support material available for us to use, and we are really looking forward to those new tools to enable us to continue being as welcoming as possible.

The third topic is what is probably on most of your minds already: ELECTION TIME. I hope you will all do what you can to help get our most compassionate and honest candidates into office as is in keeping with our Seven Principles and our Covenant, which ends with "help one another." ALL Together Quilt!



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<u>UUCP FALL YARD SALE: FRIDAY, OCTOBER 21st</u> <u>& SATURDAY, OCTOBER 22nd</u>

Many of you have asked "WHEN" is the next Yard Sale? It is finally happening in October!!! Do your "Cleaning Out" NOW while the heat index is too high to be outside. Don't wait until the week of the sale as we won't have time to get your items priced and hence these items will go unsold.

- 1. Bring items to the church beginning Sunday, October 2nd (not before please) or arrange to bring your items with someone who has a church key during the week. Remember we don't currently have an Office Administrator presence at the church during the week. Kitchen items, linens, toys, children's books, outdoor items, furniture, electronics, shoes, purses, hats, knickknacks, tools, jewelry, pictures, collectibles, appliances, gardening supplies, and pet items are all good sellers. Items can be placed in the back hallway away from the exit doors. Putting items in stackable boxes would be a "big help."
- 2. Bring us your portable folding tables by Sunday, October 16th. Be sure your name is underneath the tabletop. Tables can be picked up on Sunday, October 23rd. We always need more display tables!
- 3. Because there are so many tasks associated with planning and coordinating our Yard Sales, we are asking that you make arrangements with other church members/friends to pick up and deliver your large or heavy items to the church ahead of the sale. We need these items no later than Sunday, October 16th or Monday, October 17th to include them in the sale. Thanks for understanding.
- **4.** Plan to **stay after church Sunday, October 16th** to help with initial set up. Help is needed to set up some long tables and to bring items from storage to the church foyer. Just an hour would help a lot.
- 5. <u>Volunteer to help</u> with set up and pricing of items on Monday, October 17th, Tuesday, October 18th, and Wednesday, October 19th beginning at 9:00 a.m. (until about 4:00 p.m.) –any shift during these times will be appreciated. Contact Linda Cobb with days/times you can help. A sandwich lunch will be provided. Other food donations appreciated. We need lots of helpers just to organize items so they will sell better. No expertise required. Remember volunteer helpers find the "early bargains." We may also work Thursday, October 20th if not done on Wednesday.
- **6.** Volunteer to help with the actual sale on **Friday, Oct. 21**st and **Saturday, October 22**nd. Any shift you can work between 7:30 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. would be great. Help will be needed on Saturday after the sale to help organize and pack up any remaining items for donation to charity.

Check Out the Finance Team

The new church year is upon us, and the **Finance Team** wants to extend an **open invitation** to our Members who may have an interest in joining our Team.

The Team will meet via Zoom on Saturday morning, September 3rd at 9:30 am. If you're interested, let Laurie Winterberg know so the login info can be emailed to you.

The **biggest responsibility** of the Finance Team is to conduct the annual Budget Drive, which generally takes place in February to March of each year. Other responsibilities include reviewing finances, providing guidance, and overseeing **fundraising events**. A subgroup of the Team often actually conducts all aspects of fundraising activities, with volunteer help. Examples are last year's on-line auction, "Buy It Now," and "Certificate Mart," which allowed Members and Friends of UUCP to purchase gift certificates for goods and services donated by UUCP's Members and Friends. Our "big" indoor Yard Sales are greatly supported by the Finance Team. And we couldn't do it without a significant representation of Members and Friends who volunteer to make this event successful. It helps us raise funds to help support the church but also helps our wider non-UUCP community to shop for items at very low prices.

The Team meets (via Zoom) about 5 times a year. More frequent meetings will be needed as the work to conduct our Budget Drive begins. This includes crafting an actual budget and modifying it (with Governing Board reviews and approvals) as we draw closer to the church's Annual Congregational Meeting—generally held in May—where all members can vote on next year's budget if they have joined UUCP at least 6 weeks earlier than the meeting date.

Becoming a member of the Finance Team is SO easy—just let Laurie Winterberg know you want to join. Attending the **Sep. 3rd meeting** is certainly a step in the right direction!
