

From Your Board: President's Letter

Well, hello again, to my Beloved Church Family,

Yes, it's true that I feel that way. I do think of you as family and am so happy to have all of you in my life.

As I write this during the week before Christmas, I feel like my head is spinning a little with all that has been going on. In addition to the usual holiday preparations, which would keep me busy enough, there have been many things going on in our congregation and with our church building.

During the last month we've had some changes in our Children's Religious Education team, which you will have read about in one of our weekly emails. We are also working on hiring a new Office Administrator who will be working in the office rather than remotely. Terra has done such a

great job, and we love her dearly, but the Board and Communications team, as well as Terra herself, feel it will solve some current logistical problems if we have someone who works in the office IN the building. Since Terra moved up to Tennessee, she has been a very positive, competent, and reliable remote worker, and together we'd planned from the beginning that working remotely was a temporary situation. Fortunately, the timing for a change is serendipitous because Terra is ready to



work fewer hours so that she can have more time with family and pursue a new volunteer opportunity. We expect to have a new Office Administrator on board sometime early in February, and Terra will begin a less time-consuming job, that of spoiling another family's pets! We will miss her very much!

We've also had some building issues, namely the unlawful clearing of the property next to the church, which encroached on OUR property, and a recent insurance inspection revealing a few smaller issues, plus the larger issue of a potentially faulty electrical panels and panel components. And despite multiple calls and visits to our phone provider, we have had no luck restoring phone service to the building, although we can still leave and retrieve voicemail messages. Thank

January 1, 2023: Some Old Blues for a New Year: The Return of Steve Gunter.

A popular pianist, a new young singer, and a smooth jazz band will perform at the first Light the Dark-ness



Music Festival at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Pensacola, 9888 Pensacola Blvd.

Pianist Chris Saunders will open the festival at 2 p.m. Originally from Wales, Saunders has played in the U.S. and around the world, often in New Orleans and Nashville, including a stint with famous New Orleans trumpeter Al Hirt, and a tour through Australia with Chuck Berry. His repertoire covers Dixieland jazz, rock, pop and cabaret styles.

At 4 p.m. the six-piece band Infusion will take the stage, specializing in the jazz-pop-rock fusion of the 1970s and '80s: think Steely Dan, Sade, Average White Band, Boz Scaggs and Chicago. Members of Infusion are vocalist Resia Williams; Jim Armstrong, guitar; Thom Botsford, tenor sax; Walt Kattner, bass; and Jack Wolverton, drums.

Singer Tori Lucia will conclude the festival with a performance at 7pm. Tori is a student from Pensacola. Beyond singing, she is also a violinist, and plays piano and guitar. Recently, she released an album, "Tori Lucia & the Nitty Gritties," with her band of the same name performing their original music at local venues and music festivals.

There will be other short performances by select UUCP choir members, and some surprise art and music activities. "We have hosted some great music in past years, and this time we're putting it all together into one fabulous event with something for everyone," said Laura Keith King, President of the UUCP Board.

A donation of \$15 is suggested for admission, \$5 for students. Refreshments, including beer and wine will be available at no charge and free childcare will be provided.

UUCP will participate in the 34th anniversary of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Parade on Monday, January 16, 2023 *Will you join us?*

UUCP has been participating in the MLK Parade since its beginning. The parade is back on again after a 2-year hiatus. We've won awards for our floats and our music, and you can see our trophies in the library!

This year the theme is "What is your life's blueprint?" From a speech he gave young students in



Philadelphia, MLK said each person should have a life blueprint including three things:

- * A deep belief in their own worth and dignity,
- * A determination to achieve excellence in all endeavors,
- * A commitment to the eternal principals of beauty, love and justice.

I have been attending the MLK Parade nearly every

year since my husband Jack and I, and our two boys (7 and 10 years old) moved to Pensacola in 2000. The first parade was awe-inspiring, sharing the experience in a large crowd of people celebrating MLK. Angie Ott, a former member who also orchestrated the painting of the Rainforest Room, made huge papier mâché puppets with white and black skin tones. Three people were required to operate each: one person holding the big head-and-arms framework with a nylon cloak,

and one person at each of the arms. We walked, danced, and even had the crowd 'give the puppets five' with their VERY BIG hands! One year it was so windy we were staggering down the parade route! Eventually we retired the big puppets when they were so battered, they started looking scary.

One year we created a Peace Dove with sheets and chicken wire. (We had to retire it early when it tore in the wind).

Rev. Maggie Lovins introduced handing out our handmade tissue paper flowers to which we attached quotes by Rev. Dr. King and information about our church. We focused on gifting elder women a flower. The practice of making and gifting flowers is special to me and fills me with feelings of love and community.

We almost always have hand drummers on our floats, providing a rhythm as we proceed. We throw beads, candy and toys to the people watching, carry signs and banners, and most of all, share our common goals and make connections.

I love that Pensacola continues to honor Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King with a parade and I am so glad we can honor him by being part of it!

UUCP delivered more than two dozen blankets and at least 50 individual hygiene items to Children's Home Society (CHS) for distribution to homeless and runaway youth this winter. These young people are served by CHS in their Street Solutions youth outreach program. "We are so grateful for the donations," said CHS program manager Kelli Foster. "They will serve many youth in our program." UUCP has previously collected toilet paper, paper towels, blankets, and coats for the young men and women in the Street Solutions program.

UUCP Partners with J.U.S.T. Pensacola

We know through our work in JUST Pensacola that there are families and individuals all throughout our county that are facing difficult circumstances and are also being denied help in their moment of need. For example, we know from our house meetings that:

- Seniors are choosing between medicine, food, and paying rent.
- Young families are moving back home with their parents because they can't afford housing.
- Mothers are being forced into homelessness and living in their cars with their children.
- Families are living together in small houses to split the bills...

... and so much more.

We also know that both adults and children continue to be arrested unnecessarily for non-violent



misdemeanors. These arrest records make it harder, if not impossible, for people to get certain jobs, go to certain schools, qualify for housing and more. Our community is in the middle of an affordable rental housing crisis. The

solution we are proposing would create thousands of affordable homes for our neighbors. Join us for our Building the Heat Workshop to learn not only about our solution, but how we want to win it.





For those of you that are new to the research aspect of the process that JUST Pensacola follows, we spend 5-6 months researching the injustices to fully understand the issues and identify viable solutions to help resolve the problems. Before our meetings with city officials, we generally have a pre-meeting for an hour to be certain we're on the same page regarding the meeting ahead. In this session, the spokesperson practices and reviews questions, we make sure we are of one accord and strategize talking points in case extra support is needed.
